


Recent trends

Africa after 30 years of democratization


- Democracies:
 - •5% consolidating
 - •34% defective
 - 11% highly defective
- Autocracies:
 - •36% hardline
 - 14% moderate



Africa after 1 year of COVID-19

Global Democracy Has Grown Weaker during the COVID-19 Pandemic

Since the coronavirus outbreak began, the condition of democracy and human rights has deteriorated in 80 countries around the world.



Causes

- Causes of democratic backsliding
- Causes of authoritarian resurgence:
 - 'Autocrats' toolkit'
 - Appeal of (developmental) authoritarianism

Causes of democratic backsliding according to Gyimah-Boadi

- Illiberalism
- Elite unwillingness to relinquish control
- Government (and elite) control over the economy
- Reduced dependence on aid
- Western reluctance to promote democratization amid the rise of China and the War on Terror



Other causes of democratic backsliding

- Dominant party systems
- Presidentialism
- Neopatrimonialism
- Ethnic politics
- Civil society weakness
- Nature of the state and states-system

'Autocrats' toolkit' according to Albaugh


- Electoral fraud
- Cooptation of opposition
- Intimidation
- Manipulation of electoral boundaries
- Electoral access restrictions
- Opposition fragmentation through decentralization and political manipulation of minority language rights protections





Other tools in the autocrats' toolkit

- Skewed playing field
- Press manipulation
- Opposition as stooges of foreign interests
- Limited concessions
- Control over NGOs and internet
- Surveillance
- Removal of term limits




Autocrats' toolkit in Uganda
